Course Objective Course		The objective of this module is to acquaint students with influential Western political theorists who have significantly influenced the ideas and fundamental principles of political science in the Anglo-American tradition. The pursuit of creating a fair and equitable society and government has been a long-standing concern for all civilizations. However, the replies are not similar. They vary throughout different civilizations and during different periods of time. This course explores the concepts put forth by influential classical political philosophers, starting with Plato and concluding with Marx, whose perspectives on political issues greatly impacted political thought. The seeds of the intellectual concepts that appear to be highly developed now also had manifestations in earlier eras with varying emphasis and focal points. The course aims to analyze and evaluate ideas and traditions in a systematic manner
